THE HARVEST

For the first time, the Health and Social Service Agency financed the MAPC to offer our services in a under privileged neighbourhood, Point St. Charles. We were able to present CAP workshops in the Spring of 2011 to school personnel, student and their parents at école primaire Jeanne LeBer as well as students at la Passerelle a school for pre-school age children with a slight physical disability. An evening information session on prevention and security for children was present to young mothers at Famille en Action a community organisation also in Point St. Charles. Finally, with this financing the MAPC is in the process of redesigning the CAP pamphlet. Luc Mikelsons, a former CAP instructor and now a web designer and graphic artist is helping with the work.

Status of Women Canada has agreed to finance for two years a project which will offer an adapted one day Action workshop for Women's Shelters and Emergency Shelter. Leona Heillig, a former Action instructor and trainer is completing a collection of testimonies and success stories for publication from women who have been involved with Action.

The **Canadian Women's Foundation** will be funding the project "Awareness and Violence Prevention for Women with a physical disability". Six Workshops will be offered over the course of the year to women with various physical disabilities.

A rare harvest occurred last year when the Centre received funds from three different Ministries. They are as follows: **Robert Dutil** Minister for Public Safety, **Clement Gignac** Minister for Economic Development, Innovation and Exportation and **Kathleen Weil**, Minister for Immigration and Cultural Communities.

The **Foundation of Greater Montreal** will be financing a project, *CAP the Violence*. This will allow us to offer in February 2012, free of charge, the CAP program to students, parents and teachers of a Montreal North school, Saint-Vincent-Marie.

The **Epiderma Foundation** will be financing the project "Women Living in Crisis". Twelve workshops will be specifically directed to immigrant women, single parents and visible minorities. A lunch and day care will be provided free of charge for this one day course.

CAP IN THE FALL

The CAP team will begin the year at *l'école Henri Beaulieu*, a school we have visited previously. It is a challenging beginning as the school has over 600 children and 31 classes. Next, we are off to *Contact*, a school which offers training for intellectually challenged adults then we finish the year at two schools in Laval, *Monseigneur-Laval* and *Quatre-Vents*.

ACTION TRAINING! The MAPC will be training new self-defense instructors!

Action will be offering training for new self-defense instructors in February and March of 2012. As can be seen from the number of projects we have in the coming year these new recruits will have no shortage of courses in which to begin their careers with the Centre.

Next ACTION courses: In French, November 26 and December 3rd 2011 and January 28 and February 4th 2012 - In English, November 13th and 20th 2011.
